
**From The President's Desk,**

AAAWI executives met with Honourable **Consul General of Japan** to India, **Dr. Fukahori Yasukata**, during an event in Mumbai.



AOTS approved a program that AAWI proposed under WNF scheme for 2022-23 - **“Digitalization: A simple way to make things simple”**.

Unlike our previous two successful programs under WNF banner of AOTS, which we designed exclusively for Power and Textile sectors, we selected now a theme, spreading vastly across the industries and societies, for two reasons:

1. It is literally undergoing as a mass-movement in India, and
2. Like a myth of Team-without-Trust, Industry 4.0 and Society 5.0 as well, is null and void without Digitalization.

We received fairly warm response from AAWI members, and FAAAI/SAFAAS alumni societies, on nomination of faculty resources for 20 sessions outlined for 5-days WNF program which was bifurcated for scheduling on 22-24 November, 2022 and 8-9 December 2022. Hope an encouraging fraternity-support in participant-nomination too.

A fresh online batch of Japanese Language started with students of N5 level. It is important to mention here that, in compliance with the provisions of the National Education Policy (NEP-2020), learning any foreign language will become necessary for school students. So, it is apt for us to avail the opportunity of enlarging JLPT in schools, to tune their interests and aspirations with Japan. Success lies with internal and external supports to AAWI.

Earning an extra mileage, out of the planning for schools, with Japan relating events, seems timely and beneficial in the regions of Maharashtra and Gujarat. Then, new technology based hybrid-platform capable of conducting simultaneous on-line and off-line language programs, would be preferable in future.

Newly instituted EC, organized its first industrial program on April 29, 2022, in RCF (Rashtriya Chemicals and Fertilizers Limited), Mumbai. Mr. Tomio Isogai delivered his lecture on "True Secrets of Kaizen and 5S", while Mr. Pravin Purav, in introductory talk, briefed the overviewing perspectives, citing success stories. Both were appreciated highly for their effective topics and narration.



On request of CAAS (AOTS, Bangladesh), we nominated a resource faculty for their WNF Program on TPM.

A video talk is scheduled with ABK Dosokai, Chennai to know the best practices of their ways of managing the Association, promotional and training practices of Japanese Language, industrial linkages and reach enlargement across local societies. EC members decided for knowledge sharing sessions with different Alumni Associations of India. Our next close destinations are Kerala and Pune.

Post-pandemic focus on revenue is aptly considered in EC, as an exercise to compensate the downsized income firstly.
